When Keralites are trying to regain their pace, we take a look into the various diseases that they are prone to at this point of time. There is already break of leptospirosis and an increased risk of infection through water-borne and vector-borne diseases during floods like cholera, malaria, dengue fever to name the few.

Mulk Healthcare Enterprises is trying to look at all possibilities of assistance as stated earlier besides mass screening diagnostic solutions and medicines available.

Local health departments of the state is anticipating the worst ever epidemic fear and threat in the flood-affected areas.

The biggest threat faced is not at the relief camps but when they go back home. All the drinking water sources have been contaminated and the worst fear of epidemic threat is from the water they use. Important priority is to provide clean water supply to avoid another human tragedy.

The state health department should set up medical camps in all the flood-affected areas and is need of the hour that medical fraternity of Kerala specially those staying in urban region should come forward to be part of mandatory duty to serve in Rural Primary Health Care Centres and all the relief centres.
